LITERACY

In Phonics, we will be learning the sounds:

- 't' as in tap
- 'i' as in insect.

Please do spend some time looking at these in your Phonics practise book.



MATHS

Next week, the children will learn to count an amount which cannot be subitised. (When subitising, children can say how many there are in a small group of objects by 'just seeing' and knowing straightaway without needing to count). However, when there is a larger number they will learn to count but tapping or moving each object individually.

Activities include:

- Using ice cube trays to count objects as we put them into each space.
