Each branch has a core theme and invites pupils to learn about an aspect of Revelation, Scripture, life in Christ, and life in the Church, and to discern what their learning means academically and experientially enabling them to see, judge, and act through a deeper knowledge of the Christian faith. Years 3 and 4 will continue to the "Come and See" curriculum until materials are released.

During the last Half-term, we were delighted to welcome Jenny from CAFOD to our school. Jenny


led an assembly to the whole school before delivering workshops to multiple year groups deepening our understanding of CST!





Prophecy and Promise

During Autumn 2, children will be exploring the themes of prophecy and promise through scripture and teachings. Focus will be placed on the significance of Sunday Mass, the Liturgy of the Word, and preparing for Advent by learning about the birth of Jesus as foretold in the Old Testament. Children will also learn how the life of David connects to servant leadership. We will reflect on how these teachings help prepare us for Advent. Year 6 will examine the role of key women in salvation history, exploring their contributions to God's promises and learning about the Magnificat prayer, which reveals expectations of the Messiah.
