

## Year 1 Homework letter – 11<sup>th</sup> October – 18<sup>th</sup> October

### Dates

- In the final two weeks of the half term, we intend to take children on a local walk of the area as part of our Geography topic. We will be about 20 minutes and children will be spotting local landmarks. You will have already consented for local visits when your child joined St Anne's. The date is dependent on weather on the day. Any questions, ask your class teacher.

### Homework Tasks

1. Handwriting booklet (page 11 and 12)
2. Reading

Please read with your child every night and write in their reading diary. We expect children to read to an adult for at least 10 minutes 5x per week but preferably every evening. Books are changed on Mondays but they should be in school every day with their reading diaries.

Each week, children will be given:

- A physical rocket phonics book. The colour of this is chosen based on the sounds they know from our assessments in class.
- A digital rocket phonics book, accessible via Boost login. All children have been given a Boost login (stuck in their reading diary). This digital book is based on the sounds we are teaching in class.
- Physical reading for pleasure books. These books are picked by the children to maintain a love of reading. Children don't have to read these independently, they can have these books read to them.
